Dr. Shuzo Murakami

Dr. Shuzo Murakami, Ph. D. (engineering) is a professor emeritus at the University of Tokyo. He has served as visiting professor at the Technical University of Denmark and professor at Keio University. He has held Chairman posts for the Central Examination Committee for Architects, Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism; International Organization of Construction and Housing; and Low-Carbon Society Round Table, Eco-Model Cities for the Low Carbon Society. His areas of research include architecture and urban environment, and sustainable environment engineering.



H.E. Ms. Pia Olsen Dyhr

H.E. Ms. Pia Olsen Dyhr has been a member of the Danish Parliament since 2007 (Socialist People's Party). She became the Minister for Trade and Investment of the Kingdom of Denmark in 2011. She has served as the International Coordinator for the "Nature Conservation Society, Denmark" (2003-2006). She has also chaired the 92 Groups Forum for Sustainable Development (2006-2007). MA (political science) University of Copenhagen.



Mr. Seth Schultz

Mr. Seth Schultz is Director of Research at C40 Cities Climate Leadership Group and oversees the development of the organization's research agenda and in that role, works with key partners to develop tools and analysis to help further the goal of helping cities reduce their greenhouse gas emissions. Prior to this he created the Climate Positive Development Program, a collaboration between the Clinton Climate Initiative (CCI) and the US Green Building Council (USGBC), that supports the development of large-scale urban projects striving to reduce the amount of on-site CO2 emissions to below zero.



Mr. Gino Van Begin

Mr. Gino Van Begin, Deputy Secretary General, Regional Director for Europe, ICLEI, is also a member of the Steering Committee of the European Sustainable Cities and Towns Campaign. He co-drafted the 2004 Aalborg Commitments on urban sustainability. He was a member of the EU Expert Group to the European Commission on Urban Environment from 2003 until 2006. He has also served as a judge for the "European Green Capital" Award. He joined ICLEI 12 years ago, and was appointed his current post in 2007.



Dr. John Beard

Dr. John Beard is Director of the Department of Ageing and Life Course with the World Health Organization in Geneva. He works with the global community to meet the challenges, and to maximize the benefits, associated with the rapid ageing of their populations. He is a member of the World Economic Forum's Global Action Council on Ageing. John is an Australian physician who has held a range of senior public health and academic roles in Australia and the USA. He has published widely in the international literature and remains actively involved in several large international research studies.

●C40 Cities Climate Leadership Group

C40 was advocated by the Lord Mayor of London and was founded in 2005. It is a network of the largest cities in the world committed to battling climate change, facilitating global leadership on climate change initiatives, sharing knowledge and facilitating cooperation among cities. Members include 40 member cities and 19 affiliate cities.

●ICLEI - Local Governments for Sustainability

ICLEI is an international association of local governments committed to sustainable development. It was established at the World Congress of Local Governments for a Sustainable Future at the United Nations in New York in 1990. Today, members include more than 1,200 local governments from 70 countries.

●WHO (World Health Organization)

With the aim of realizing "age-friendly cities", WHO published the "WHO Global Age-friendly Cities Guide" in 2007. WHO also launched a Global Network of Age-friendly Cities with the goal of facilitating cooperation among 500 cities and regions from 14 countries.
