The International Forum on the “FutureCity” Initiative is an international conference in which representatives of cities in Japan and other countries, along with various experts, take the stage to discuss solutions for the challenges of the environment and aging that the world has in common. The theme of the 6th Forum is ‘Creating “FutureCities” to Invigorate Localities: Universally Appealing Communities.’

The aim of the invigoration of localities is to halt the decline in the birthrate and the aging of the population, conquer the depopulation of regional areas and the shrinking of regional economies, and secure long-term growth potential into the future. As populations decline and society ages, what concrete actions should we take to build sustainable communities in which everyone can lead rich, comfortable, and healthy lives? At the Forum, we will discuss this question from a variety of perspectives, looking at the examples of overseas cities, as well as advanced case studies of Japanese cities that have been implementing the “FutureCity” Initiative.

In the hope that it will offer many useful hints for raising the effectiveness of efforts to invigorate localities, which are reaching full roll-out stage.

Dr. Hiroto Izumi Special Advisor to the Prime Minister

Dr. Izumi has served the Japanese Government as Special Advisor to the Prime Minister, responsible for Building National Resilience, Overcoming Population Decline and Vitalizing Local Economy and Healthcare Policy since 2013. Prior to his current position, he served as Special Advisor to the Cabinet from 2012, and as Director-General at the Regional Revitalization Bureau in the Cabinet Secretariat from 2009. Mr. Izumi started his career in 1976 at the Ministry of Construction, and has served in various posts such as Director-General at the Housing Bureau from 2007-2009. Dr. Izumi, born in Kanagawa Prefecture in 1953, is a graduate of Tokyo University and has a doctorate degree in Engineering. In addition, he is a professor at National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies.

Dr. Shuzo Murakami President, Institute for Building Environment and Energy Conservation(IBECE)



Dr. Shuzo Murakami, Ph. D. (engineering) is a professor emeritus at the University of Tokyo.
He has served as visiting professor at the Technical University of Denmark, professor at Keio University, and President of Building Research Institute. He has held Chairman posts for Architectural Institute of Japan; International Organization of Construction and Housing; and Low-Carbon Society Round Table, Eco-Model Cities for the Low Carbon Society. His areas of research include architecture and urban environment, and sustainable environment engineering. He was awarded the ASHRAE Fellow Award in 2002, SCANVAC the John Rydberg Gold Medal in 2002, and Architectural Institute of Japan Award in 2014.

Dr. Hiroko Akiyama Professor, Institute of Gerontology, The University of Tokyo



Hiroko Akiyama, a social psychologist, is professor at the Institute of Gerontology, University of Tokyo and the former vice president of Science Council of Japan. Professor Akiyama has conducted a number of cross-national surveys and is widely recognized as an expert on issues of global aging. She is known for the long-running research on the elderly in Japan—tracking the aging patterns of approximately 6,000 Japanese elderly for 25 years. Recently she initiated social experiment projects that pioneer to re-design communities to meet the needs of the highly aged society and allow the elderly to successfully 'age-in-place'. She started the Institute of Gerontology at University of Tokyo in 2006. Professor Akiyama received Ph.D. in psychology from University of Illinois, the United States.

Dr. Kazuhiko Takemoto Professor, Director of the United Nations University Institute for the Advanced Study of Sustainability(UNU-IAS)



Prof. Takemoto is Director of the United Nations University Institute for the Advanced Study of Sustainability (UNU-IAS), as well as a Visiting Professor of the University of Tokyo, Integrated Research System for Sustainability Science (IRSS).
Prior to joining UNU, he developed policies on international environmental cooperation and the global environment, in particular, climate change and bio-diversity as Vice-Minister for Global Environment Affairs (2008-2010) and as a Director-General of the Environmental Management Bureau (2005-08).
He served for CBD/COP10 as Alternate President (2010), CSD-18 as Co-Chair (2010), OECD/EPOC as Vice Chair (2004-07) and UNFCCC/COP3 as Special Assistant to the President (1997). He is a Council Member of the International Institute for Applied Systems Analysis (IIASA).
He holds a PhD in environmental engineering from The University of Tokyo.

Dr. Lohani is currently Global Head of Climate Change Practice and Distinguished Fellow, Emerging Market Forum, Centennial Group, USA; Distinguished Fellow, Institute for Global Environment Strategies, Japan; Distinguished Adjunct Faculty and Board of Trustee member at the Asian Institute of Technology, Bangkok; Special Advisor for the Y-Port Center, Networking Among Cities and Private Firms, The City of Yokohama, Japan; Founding Member and Board of Trustees member of the Asian Water Council, Korea; International Advisory Panel member, Institute of Water Policy, LKYSPP, Singapore; and External Sustainability Advisory Council member, Ingersoll Rand, USA.
Dr. Lohani is an elected member of the National Academy of Engineering (NAE) of the United States. He has also been elected to the rank of AAAS Fellow by the American Association for the Advancement of Science (AAAS).

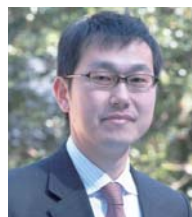
Dr. Ronald Hall Principal Adviser to the Director-General, Directorate-General for Regional Policy European Commission



Dr. Hall works for the European Commission, which he joined in 1989. He has worked principally in field of policy development in the Directorate General responsible for European Union regional development policies. Between 1999 and 2004, he was Deputy Chief Adviser to the European Commissioner responsible for regional policy. Dr. Hall has been Director of the Directorate General for regional policy since November 2004, and Senior Advisor to the Director General since October 2012. His responsibilities today include International Cooperation on regional policy, Chair of the Commission's Northern Ireland Task Force created by former President Barroso and Adviser to the annual Open Days Conference of Regions and Cities.

Dr. Fujino was born in 1972, the year that The Limits to Growth was published. As a post-graduate student, he undertook a long-term analysis of global energy systems, which led to his taking a position in the National Institute for Environmental Studies in April 2000.
In his research into scenarios for a low-carbon Japanese society, he has envisioned a society that will achieve major reductions in CO2 emissions by 2050. Through this and other work, he became involved in the development of Japan's global warming targets and concepts for the "FutureCity" Initiative.
His interests also extend to the development of low-carbon society scenarios for Asian countries and cities, as well as strategies for the realization of those scenarios.
Since the Great East Japan Earthquake, he has been particularly involved in the reconstruction of Fukushima and reconstruction planning for the village of Iitate.
Since April 2016, he has concurrently held the position of Principal Researcher at the Institute for Global Environmental Strategy (IGES).

Prof. Yoshinori Hiroi Professor, Kokoro Research Center, Kyoto University



Professor Hiroi was born in 1961 in Okayama Prefecture. He graduated from the College of Arts and Sciences of the University of Tokyo (majoring in science history and philosophy of science), and obtained his Masters' degree at the same university. After a period working for the Ministry of Health and Welfare, he became an Associate Professor at the Faculty of Law, Politics & Economics of Chiba University in 1996. He was made Professor at that faculty in 2003. While at Chiba University, he enjoyed a stint as a visiting researcher at MIT in 2001-2002. He took up his current position in April 2016, where he specializes in public policy and philosophy of science.

Professor Hiroi was awarded the Economist Prize for his book Social Security in Japan, and the Osaragi Jiro Prize for Questioning Community.

In the course of his career, Professor Hiroi has served on a number of panels and committees, including the Education Renaissance Advisory Committee; the Japan International Cooperation Agency's (JICA) Social Security Thematic Issues Support Committee; the Toyota Foundation's Regional Society Program; the Cabinet Office's Commission on Measuring Well-being, Japan; the Yokohama City FutureCity Promotion Council; and the Cabinet Office's General Special Zones Evaluation and Study Panel.

Dr. Toshio Kitahara Professor Emeritus, Chiba University



Born in 1947, Professor Kitahara is a Doctor of Engineering, having completed the Ph.D. program at the University of Tokyo Graduate School. After serving as Research Associate at Nagoya University and Associate Professor at Mie University, he became a Professor at Chiba University Graduate School. With the goal of making cities, the arena of people's lives and activities, richer and more appealing places in terms of both tangible and intangible aspects, he is involved in the planning and design of public spaces and townscapes, and is engaged in the use of public spaces in ways in which residents can participate, such as the Parasol Gallery. Other positions Professor Kitahara has held include Coordinator for the Place-making Symposium (2014) hosted by the Ministry of Land, Infrastructure, Transport and Tourism. His main original published works include Leveraging Public Spaces to Build Bustling Communities [Kokyo Kukan no Katsuyou to Nigiwai Machizukuri], and he has also translated a number of books into Japanese, including Cities for People by Jan Gehl, and Townscape by Gordon Cullen.

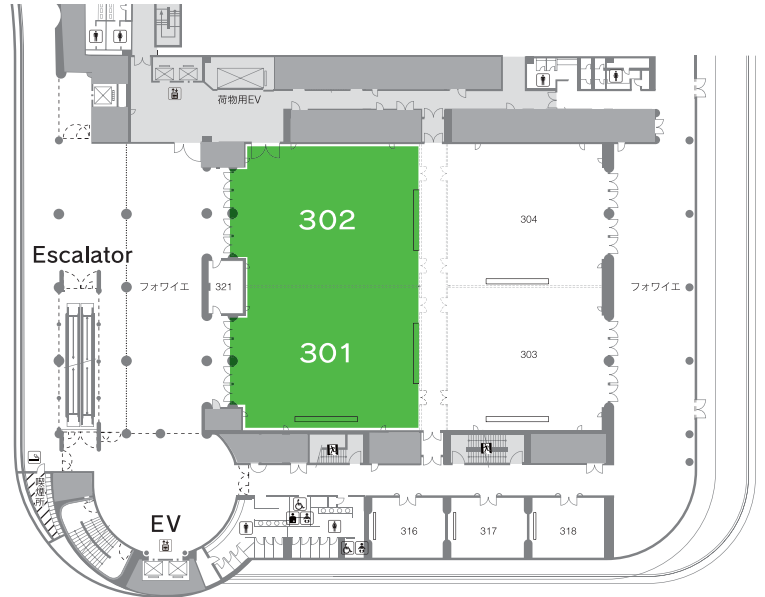

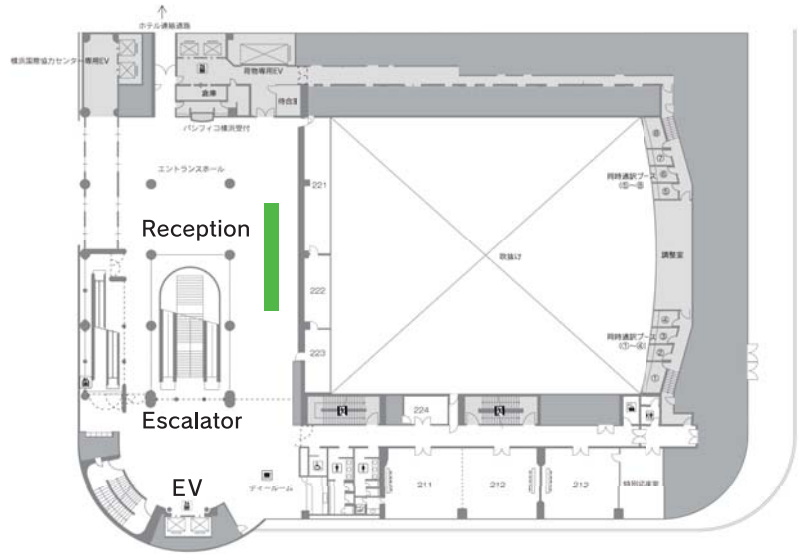
